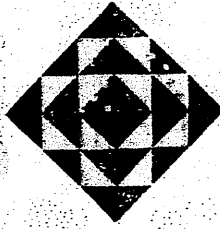

# Flying Geese



## CUT FABRICS

From each assorted red and brown print, cut:

- 6—3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 12 small triangles total

From one light print, cut:

- 2—4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 4 medium triangles total

- 2—8 $\frac{3}{8}$ " squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 4 large triangles total

## ASSEMBLE BLOCKS

1. Sew together a red or brown print small triangle and a light print small triangle to make a small triangle-square

square (*Diagram 1*). Press seam toward red or brown print. The small triangle-square should be 3" square including seam allowances.

2. Referring to *Diagram 2*, lay out three triangle-squares and three assorted red or brown print small triangles in rows. Sew together pieces in each row. Press seams in one direction, alternating direction with each row. Join rows to make a triangle unit.

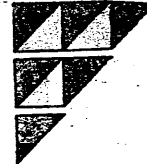

3. Sew a light print large triangle to a triangle unit's long edge to make a block (*Diagram 3*). Press seam toward light print. The block should be 8" square including seam allowances.

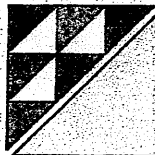
